Feast Days in the Sixteenth Week of Ordinary Time

- Mon 22 July: Feast day for St Mary Magdalene. Mark 16:9 tells us that Mary was the first to whom
 the risen Christ appeared. She was one of his disciples, accompanied him on his journeys through
 the villages preaching (Luke 8:3), and stood by the cross at Christ's crucifixion.
- <u>Tue 23 July</u>: Optional for **St Bridget**, religious. Born Sweden 1303, of high society. Married at 13yrs and had eight children. She and her husband lived devout lives. After his death in 1344, Bridget lived with even greater asceticism, receiving revelations and appealing to kings of Europe and the Pope for peace and the restoration of the papacy to Rome. Went to Rome for the Holy Year in 1350, and lived there the rest of her life in poverty. Sought approval for foundation of a religious community (now known as the Bridgetines), approved after her death in 1373.
- Wed 24 July: Optional for St Sharbel Makhluf, priest. A Lebanese monk, born in a small mountain
 village and ordained in 1858. Devoted to the BVM, he spent the last 23 years of his life as a hermit.
 Despite temptations to wealth and comfort, Sharbel taught the value of poverty, self-sacrifice, and
 prayer by the way he lived. Died 1898.
- <u>Thu 25 July:</u> FEAST OF ST JAMES, APOSTLE. James was the brother of John the Apostle, son of Zebedee, the fisherman. He was present at the bringing to life of Jairus' daughter, and at the Transfiguration. Beheaded by Herod Agrippa in about 42 AD.
- <u>Fri 26 July</u>: Memorial for Sts Joachim and Anne, parents of the BVM. These names are given to the
 parents of the Blessed Virgin by a tradition dating back to the second century. As St John Damascene
 wrote: 'O blessed couple. All creation is in your debt. For through you is presented the noblest of gifts
 to the creator, namely a spotless mother who alone was worthy for the creator'.

Waiting On The Lord

God wants to dwell with each of us personally, intimately—as the mysterious guests once visited Abraham's tent, as Jesus once entered the home of Mary and Martha.

By his hospitality in this week's First Reading, Abraham shows us how we are to welcome the Lord into our lives. His selfless service of his divine guests (see Hebrews 13:1) stands in contrast to the portrait of Martha drawn in this week's Gospel.

Where Abraham is concerned only for the well-being of his guests, Martha speaks only of herself—"Do you not care that my sister has left me by myself? . . . Tell her to help me." Jesus' gentle rebuke reminds us that we risk missing the divine in the mundane, that we can fall into the trap of believing that God somehow needs to be served by human hands (see Acts 17:25).

Our Lord comes to us not to be served but to serve (see Matthew 20:28). He gave His life that we might know the one thing we need, the "better part," which is life in the fellowship of God.

Jesus is the true Son promised today by Abraham's visitors (see Matthew 1:1). In Him, God has made an everlasting covenant for all time, made us blessed descendants of Abraham (see Genesis 17:19, 21; Romans 4:16–17, 19–21).

The Church now offers us this covenant, bringing to completion the word of God, the promise of His plan of salvation, what Paul calls "the mystery hidden for ages."

As once He came to Abraham, Mary, and Martha, Christ now comes to each of us in Word and Sacrament. As we sing in this week's Psalm: He will make His dwelling with those who keep His Word and practice justice (see also John 14:23).

If we do these things we will not be anxious or disturbed, will not have our Lord taken from us. We will wait on the Lord, who told Abraham and tells each of us: "I will surely return to you."

Before we can offer hospitality we must be open to being surprised. Before we can welcome God into our lives we must be convinced of the possibility that God acts in strange ways and can come to us under the most unlikely guises.
