The Season of Creation ends this weekend officially, with the Feast of St Francis of Assisi.

But we are encouraged to continue taking seriously our role as *kaitiaki* of Creation. As Pope Francis says: "Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue; it is not an optional or a secondary aspect of our Christian experience."

Fill us with peace, all powerful God, that we may live as brothers and sisters, harming no one.

Lifting Covid19 Restrictions
for Liturgies in Devonport Parish
1st October 2022

1. Hand sanitisers will continue to be provided in church
2. Masks: Optional according to government regulations. Be aware of other people's needs. Ministers of Communion wear masks.
3. Holy water available in church fountains
4. Sign of peace: Continue bowing for the present. Be aware of other people's sensitivities.
5. Communion on the tongue: Discouraged because of often unavoidable contact with people's saliva. If people insist on this practice, they should come last and be aware they are putting the Communion minister at risk. Communion minister may avoid them.
6. Communion from the chalice: Delay re-introducing the cup until we are more sure of the health situation.

These protocols will be revised as more information becomes available from the Ministry of Health.



Congratulations to Denise O'Shaughnessy and Linda Lampen-Smith who were elected as Co-Chairs of the Parish Pastoral Council at our meeting this week. (see the other members on the noticeboard in the foyer)

2 new Members were elected at the AGM, and since then we have had a Formation Day, looking at how the grace of God can enable imperfect people to work together and bring about the realm of God on earth. On Tuesday we decided to implement a Mission Testimony Series, which will begin mid-October, enabling us to hear from other parishioners what Mission looks like in their lives. We continued to discuss the AV Upgrade, which we are keen to advance by the end of the year if possible. We have already received a donation that will cover more than half the \$19K cost, and we are seeking additional one-off donations, of whatever you can afford. Of course, the Columbarium project is ongoing, and we hope to have a figure soon for the cost of individual niches, so we can start a marketing plan. In the meantime, please have a look at the drawings at the back of the Church.

The Liturgy Committee is starting a recruitment drive for more members, and training will be provided. **It has been decided to discontinue the Monday morning 8 a.m. Liturgy, based on lack of demand.**

Chapter 17 of Luke is read on the 27th and 28th Sundays in Ordinary Time. The Lectionary focuses on two stories — the dutiful servant (today) and the healing of the lepers (next Sunday). Jesus teaches that salvation is a gift of God to which no one has a right and which no one can earn (dutiful servant) and that this gift is offered to all (healing of the lepers).

Feast Days in the Twenty-Seventh Week Ordinary Time

- **Tue 4 Oct:** Memorial for **St Francis of Assisi**. Born 1181, the son of a wealthy merchant. Gave up everything to obey the call of the Lord. Lived in complete poverty & preached the gospel. Others came to join him, and so began the Franciscan Order, which spread rapidly in his lifetime. His life was a putting into practice the beatitudes. Died 1226.
- **Thu 6 Oct:** Optional for **St Bruno, priest**. Born Cologne about 1030. Was ordained and for many years ran the Cathedral at Rheims. Felt called to asceticism and solitude and so retired to mountains near Grenoble with a few companions. So began the Carthusian Order. He died in 1101.
- **Fri 7 Oct:** Memorial for **Our Lady of the Rosary**. This feast has been celebrated since the Christian victory over the Turks at the battle of Lepanto in 1571.
