### 2ND SUNDAY OF ADVENT - 4TH DECEMBER 2022

#### **Explaining the tradition of the Advent Wreath**

The circle, a line which never ends, is symbolic of the infinite love of God . Greenery, especially in the northern hemisphere, where it is winter, and nature seems dead, symbolises resurrection and eternal life. Here, in the early days of summer, that resurrection in nature is under way, and a dash of colour can be added. Our harakeke woven mats symbolise our connection to te ao Maori.

We light one candle on the first Sunday of Advent, and this is called the candle of Hope **Tūmanako**, or sometimes the candle of prophecy. We light two candles on the second Sunday of Advent, and this is called the candle of Peace, **Rangimarie**. The angels sang about



peace on earth. We light three candles on the third Sunday of Advent, and this is called the candle of Joy Harikoa. The angels told the shepherds that Jesus birth was joyful news for everybody. The fourth candle is called the candle of Love, Aroha. God so loved the world, that

Jesus, son of God, became son of Mary, God with us, Emmanuel.

Members of our choir are joining with the Anglican choir at Holy Trinity in Devonport this Sunday, December 4th at 7 pm in this beautiful Advent tradition. The choir is 45 strong and will be singing 5 wonderful pieces together with 7 congregational carols.

#### Feast Days in the First Week of Advent

- <u>Tue 6 Dec</u>: Optional for **St Nicholas, bishop**. Bishop of Myra in Lycia in the 3<sup>rd</sup> century. Very little is known in fact of his life, though a great tradition has grown around him and popular devotion to him from early times. It's said that his incorrupt body exuded the odour of myrrh with healing property. Stories of his generosity led to a tradition of giving gifts in his name at Christmas time, hence his association with the season.
- Wed 7 Dec: Memorial for St Ambrose, bishop and doctor of the Church. Born 339 at Trier, practiced in Roman law-courts and appointed to office in Milan. While still a catechumen was elected Bishop of Milan by the laity hesitated to accept, but was baptized, ordained and studied theology, became famous as a preacher & defender of the faith. He received St Augustine into the Church. He fought paganism and protected the Church against political power.
- Thu 8 Dec: Solemnity for The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. (Gen 3:9-15,20; Ps 98; Eph 1:3-6,11-12; Lk 1:26-38).
- Fri 9 Dec: Optional for St Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin, to whom Our Lady appeared on this day in 1531 at Guadalupe, leaving a miraculous image on his cloak.
