They respond by leaving their ordinary occupations and redirecting their lives to a new way of service to bring about the realm, or kingdom, of God, in their midst. That realm is in our midst today. NZ speaking tour on Palestine by Brother Peter Bray FSC, Vice-Chancellor of Bethlehem University

Br Peter has been invited by the NZ Catholic Bishops Conference for a speaking tour of the six dioceses between 24 January and 9 February.

Br Peter moved from Wellington to Bethlehem, the birthplace of Jesus, in 2008 to take up the vice-chancellor role. His work as a teacher and education consultant has taken him around the world.

Bethlehem University was founded by Br Peter's De la Salle Bothers in 1973. It was the first registered university established in the Occupied West Bank territory of Palestine and is the only Catholic university in the Holy Land. It currently has 3259 students (Muslim and Christian), 17,282 graduates and 214 faculty members. It celebrates its Golden Jubilee this year.

Br Peter's speaking tour follow the New Zealand Catholic bishops publishing a statement last July urging action to solve the decades-old Israel-Palestine issue.

Feast Days in the Third Week of Ordinary Time

- <u>Tue 24 Jan</u>: Memorial for **St Francis de Sales, bishop and doctor of the Church**. Bishop of Geneva at the time of Calvin, he strove for the renewal of the faith. His "Introduction to the Devout Life" is a classic of spiritual direction, and is still read. He died on 28 Dec 1622, at the age of 55. Patron saint of journalists. **Patron of our parish**.
- <u>Wed 25 Jan</u>: Feast for **The Conversion of St Paul, Apostle.** This day celebrates Paul's encounter with Jesus, in a blinding light, on the road to Damascus which so radically changed him. See Act 9:1-22 or Acts 22:3-16.
- <u>Thu 26 Jan</u>: Memorial for **St Timothy and St Titus**, bishops. Disciples and co-workers of St Paul. Timothy accompanied Paul on his travels. He was in charge of the Church at Ephesus. Titus was Paul's messenger to various Christian communities where disputes arose, and he was in charge of the Church at Crete. To these two Paul wrote his pastoral letters.
- <u>Fri 27 Jan</u>: Optional for **St Angela Merici**, **virgin**. Born at Desenzano, near Brescia, 1470. Saw her task as the formation of Christian women: in 1535 founded institute of Ursulines, devoted to education of poor girls, and to the missions. She died in 1540.
- Sat 28 Jan: Memorial for St Thomas Aquinas, priest & doctor of the Church. Born about 1225.
