After a shaky start, due to flooding, Auckland students are now embarked on the 2023 school year. The start of the year has also seen a political shake-up, and this affects the role of political advocacy played by the **New Zealand Catholic Schools' Office.** 

#### From their newsletter:

The recent resignation of Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern was the first significant announcement of the New Year that will impact on the state integrated school sector. Whatever your political views and opinions on this Labour government, the role of Prime Minister is a challenging one that requires personal sacrifice and utter commitment to carry out effectively. (We) therefore want to thank Prime Minister Ardern for her service to the country and for her part in navigating the country through a number of serious challenges. It is not a role for the faint hearted and we wish her well and hope that she enjoys more time with her whānau while she reassesses her future. Ngā mihi nui me te aroha nui.

Education Minister Chris Hipkins has now been appointed the 41st Prime Minister of New Zealand and ... we have met the now Minister of Education Jan Tinetti before Christmas. Minister Tinetti was very welcoming and has agreed to meet with our organisation on a regular cycle in 2023. Her understanding of the state integrated sector will be a real benefit as our sector continues to navigate a range of challenges including changing values in our society.

#### Feast Days in the Sixth Week of Ordinary Time

- <u>Tues 14 Feb</u>: Memorial for **Sts Cyril, monk, and Methodius, bishop**. Cyril and Methodius were brothers, born in Salonika about 825 and educated at Constantinople. They translated the bible, and liturgical texts, into the Slavonic language. Cyril died in Rome this day in 869. Methodius was made bishop and spent many years preaching in Hungary, despite resistance and hostility. He died in 885.
- <u>Fri 17 Feb</u>: Optional for **The Seven Founders of the Order of Servites**. Seven laymen of the city of Florence in the mid-13th Century, renounced the world and lived as hermits on Monte Senario. They had a particular devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary; they spent themselves in the care of others and in preaching throughout Tuscany. The Order of Servites was founded by those who came to follow them: first recognized in 1304.
