From Matthew's gospel over the next four weeks we will hear extracts from the Sermon on the Mount. It is generally accepted that Matthew shaped much of his gospel around five 'speeches', which appear to parallel the five books of the Torah attributed to Moses. Jesus, Matthew suggests, is a new Moses who offers teaching that both fulfils and goes far beyond the original Torah.

Feast Days in the Fifth Week Ordinary Time

- . Mon 6 Feb: Waitangi Day.
- <u>Tues 7 Feb</u>: Memorial for **St Paul Miki and companions, martyrs**. Paul was the son of a Japanese military leader. Educated by the Jesuits and himself joined the Order in 1580, becoming known for his eloquent preaching. He was crucified, along with 25 other Catholics, at Nagasaki on 5 Feb. 1597 during the persecution of Christians under the Taiko, Toyotoni Hideyoshi, in the name of the Emperor. They were canonized in 1862 as the Martyrs of Japan.
- Wed 8 Feb: Optional for St Josephine Bakhita. Born in the Sudan in 1869; kidnapped into slavery at an early age; taken to Italy by a good family where, in response to God's grace, entered the Daughters of Charity, where everyone still calls her "Mother Moretta" (our Black Mother). She died 8 Feb 1947 at the Canossian convent in Schio. Canonized in 2000.
- Wed 8 Feb: Optional for St Jerome Emiliani. Born in 1486, at Venice. Began life as a soldier, but was
 converted to Christ and gave all his possessions to the poor and devoted his life to serving them.
 Founded the Order of Clerks Regular known as the Somaschi. He died of the plague in 1537.
- <u>Fri 10 Feb</u>: Memorial for St Scholastica, virgin. Born at Norcia in Umbria in the late 5th Century, the sister of St Benedict. She consecrated herself to God in early childhood, and lived near her brother's monastery at Monte Cassino.
- <u>Sat 11 Feb</u>: Optional for Our Lady of Lourdes. The appearance of the Immaculate Virgin Mary to Bernadette Soubirous in 1858 near Lourdes in France was a call to penance and prayer, which has
