Parishioners will remember the Mission presentation that we made last year about Marunui, the conservation project we are part of near Mangawhai. Marunui was hard hit by the rain deluge on Friday 24 February which caused some massive slips on the property. One of these slips completely destroyed our friend Jackie Fanning's house and vehicle. You may have seen her story on the front page of the NZ Herald on Monday. Jackie was lucky to escape with her life but lost everything and is now faced with rebuilding from scratch. Just as we always hear the story of Jesus' testing on the first Sunday of Lent, so we always hear of his transfiguration on the second. But the story makes clear that we cannot stay with this vision; Jesus must come down from the mountain and continue on his way, as must we.

Feast Days in the Second Week of Lent

- <u>Tue 7 Mar</u>: Optional for St Perpetua and St Felicity, martyrs. Perpetua was 22, of a patrician family; Felicity was a slave: both were martyred in the public stadium at Carthage, in 203, during the persecution of Septimus Severus.
- <u>Wed 8 Mar</u>: Optional for **St John of God, religious**. Born Portugal, 1495. An adventurous youth as a soldier. A sermon of St John of Avila turned his mind to the sufferings of the poor and sick, and he devoted the rest of his life to their care, establishing hospitals for the outcasts of society. His followers established the Order of Hospitallers of St John of God. He died in 1550.
- * Thu 9 Mar: Optional for St Frances of Rome, religious. Born in Rome, 1384. She married and had three children. Her husband was well-off, the marriage was happy, and she devoted herself to the care of the needy. In 1425 she founded the Congregation of Oblates, following the rule of St Benedict. She died in 1440
