



The time is now to Invest in Our Planet. **FASHION** -We learned recently on TVNZ (*Sunday* on March 12) that the fashion industry worldwide is responsible for about 10% of global carbon emissions. Much of it is produced in exploitative working conditions.

• <u>Fri 21 April</u> Optional for **St Anselm, bishop and doctor of the Church**. Born in Piedmont in 1033, Anselm entered the Benedictine Order at the monastery of Le Bec in France, where he taught theology. He became Archbishop of Canterbury in 1093, and fought strenuously for the freedom of the Church from the temporal power. A man of great holiness, his writings, particularly on mystical theology, are renowned.
