This Sunday's readings are an invitation to a renewed sense of God and ourselves. After hearing Wisdom's description of God's immensity as the source of God's loving kindness, we listen to Paul's teaching about prayer. In the Gospel knowing that weeds grow in the midst of wheat, Jesus tells us not to worry about failures. God's reign is like the mustard seed — a dynamic that can't be stopped. ## Feast Days in the Sixteenth Week of Ordinary Time

- <u>Mon 24 Jul</u>: Optional for **St Sharbel Makhluf, priest**. A Lebanese monk, born in a small mountain village and ordained in 1858. Devoted to the BVM, he spent the last 23 years of his life as a hermit. Despite temptations to wealth and comfort, Sharbel taught the value of poverty, self-sacrifice and prayer, by the way he lived. Died 1898.
- <u>Tue 25 Jul</u>: Feast of St James, Apostle. James was the brother of John the Apostle, son of Zebedee, the fisherman. He was present at the bringing to life of Jairus' daughter, and at the Transfiguration. Beheaded by Herod Agrippa in about 42 AD.
- <u>Wed 26 Jul</u>: Memorial for Sts Joachim and Anne, parents of the BVM. These names are given to the parents of the Blessed Virgin by a tradition dating back to the second century. As St John Damascene wrote: 'O blessed couple. All creation is in your debt. For through you is presented the noblest of gifts to the creator, namely a spotless mother who alone was worthy for the creator'.
- <u>Sat 29 Jul</u>: Memorial for **St Martha**. The sister of Mary and Lazarus; she appears in the Gospel three times when she receives the Lord into her house and waits on him; at the resurrection of Lazarus, when she proclaims her faith in Jesus, 'Son of the living God'; and in John 12:2, at the meal given to Jesus six days before the Passover.
