Feast Days in the Twenty-first Week of Ordinary Time

- Mon 28 Aug: Memorial for St Augustine, bishop and doctor of the Church. Born at Thagaste, Nth Africa 354, Augustine was a brilliant young man whose early life was wild and unsettled. He was converted by the prayers of his mother, and baptized by St Ambrose, Bishop of Milan in 387. Returned to Africa and lived an ascetic life. Became Bishop of Hippo. His many writings present a theology and a spirituality that are exceptional, and have had great influence, even today.
- Tue 29 Aug: Memorial for The Passion of St John the Baptist. (Thess. 4:13-18, Psalm 71, Mark 6:17-29).
- Fri 1 Sept: Day of prayer for the Care of Creation. The month from 1 Sep to 4 Oct (St Francis of Assisi) is dedicated to awareness and prayer for creation.
