## Solemn Feast of the ASSUMPTION of the BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

The National Patronal Feast for Aotearoa New Zealand.

Tuesday, $15^{\text {th }}$ August
12 noon Mass (with St Leo's students)
Evening Mass at 7.00pm

This feast links Mary's unique destiny with her role as the Mother of God. Her privilege is a sign and promise for all the People of God. The Gospel for today is Luke 1:39-59
which includes Mary's jubilant song of praise. It's a mosaic of phrases from the Old Testament and relates in particular to the song of Hannah at her son Samuel's birth. Luke presents Mary bringing to fulfilment the long succession of Israel's "poor in spirit". She gathers their prayers together in one great hymn of blessing we call the Magnificat.
My soul magnifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God, my Saviour.
We too magnify the Lord by our prayer and action.

## Feast Days in the Nineteenth Week of Ordinary Time

- Mon 14 Aug: Memorial for St Maximillian Kolbe, priest. Born Poland 1894, became a Franciscan. Got TB, recovered but remained frail. Before ordination he founded the Immaculata Movement devoted to Our Lady. Captured by Nazis and sent to Auschwitz where, on 31 July 1941 he offered himself in place of one of 10 men condemned to die by starvation. He was the last to die after two weeks of suffering. Canonized in 1981 by JP II.
- Tue 15 Aug: Solemnity for THE ASSUMPTION of the BLESSED VIRGIN MARY. Patroness of Aotearoa NZ. Holy Day of obligation. In Mary's glorious assumption we celebrate the fulfillment of our Christian destiny, and with her we proclaim the greatness of the Lord.
- Wed 9 Aug: Optional for St Stephen of Hungary. Born about 969, baptised about 985, crowned king of Hungary in 1000. Stephen ruled wisely in the country, and did all he could for the establishment of the Church there. Died 1038.
- Sat 19 Aug: Optional for St John Eudes, priest. Born in France 1601, lived mostly in Normandy. Founded the Institute of Our Lady of Charity to help prostitutes; and the Congregation of Jesus and Mary, whose work was the running of Seminaries, which he established at Caen, Coutances, Lisieux and Rouen. Promoted devotion to the Sacred heart of Jesus and
