Where are we at with the Columbarium ?

There is a dedicated Project Group which has continued work on costings and design, as well as putting significant input into the various drafts of a National Policy on Columbaria requested by the New Zealand Catholic Bishops' Conference, Given the four years' work we have put into this, and the generous financial backing by a single donor over that time, we had hoped to be given permission to proceed, and had even offered to be the trial project for the Policy. However, a letter from Bishop Steve this week advises that "due process must be followed". This refers to both the NZCBC confirmation of the policy, and a review process of parishes in the Auckland Diocese, which is underway. We have not been given a timeframe or details for this.

The story of the Transfiguration offers much to reflect on. While it invites us to contemplate the glory of God manifest in Jesus, it also challenges us to be true disciples of the Son of Man. To follow Jesus is to seek the will of God in persistent prayer, to dare surrender to the Holy One, and then to come down from the mountain of glory and continue the way of the cross.

Feast Days in the Eighteenth Week of Ordinary Time

- Mon 7 Aug: Optional for St Sixtus II, pope & martyr, and his companions. Elected Pope in 257. In 258 he was put to death, along with four deacons, while saying Mass in the catacombs of St Callistus.
- <u>Tue 8 Aug</u>: Feast of St Mary of the Cross (MacKillop), religious. First Australian to be canonized. Born in Melbourne. Concerned with the poor and suffering. Founded the Srs of St Joseph and of the Sacred Heart, dedicated to educating children. Received papal approval for her work in 1888 by Leo XIII. When she died in 1909, there were 1,000 women in her congregation.
- <u>Wed 9 Aug</u>: Optional for **St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein)**. Born 1891 in Breslau, Poland, the youngest in a large Jewish family. A student of philosophy. Became interested in the Catholic faith and was baptised in the Cathedral at Cologne. Entered the Cologne Carmel, but due to the politics of the time was sent to Carmel at Echt, Holland. When Nazis captured Holland she was arrested and, along with her sister Rose, sent to Auschwitz, where she died in the gas chamber in 1942.
- <u>Thu 10 Aug</u>: Feast day for St Lawrence, deacon and martyr. A deacon of the Church of Rome, who died four days after Pope Sixtus and his four companion deacons.
- Fri 11 Aug: Memorial for St Clare, virgin. Born in Assisi in 1193, Clare followed St Francis in his life of poverty. She founded the order of Poor Clares. Her life was austere and prayerful.
- <u>Sat 12 Aug</u>: Optional for **St Jane Frances de Chantal, religious**. Born Dijon, France in 1572, married and had six children. After her husband's death, Frances de Sales became her spiritual director. Founded the Congregation of the Visitation for women who wished to live a religious life but could not endure the austerity of existing orders. She spent her life caring for the sick and poor, and died in 1641
