Feast Days in the Twenty-fourth Week of Ordinary Time

- **Tue 19 Sept**: Optional for **St Januarius, bishop & martyr**. Bishop of Benevento, martyred in 305, with six other Christians, during the persecution of Diocletian, at Naples.
- Wed 20 Sept: Memorial for St Andrew Kim Tae-gon, Paul Chong Ha-sañg & Companions, martyrs. Andrew Kim Taegon was the first Korean priest and pastor. Paul Chong Hasañg a lay apostle. They, along with 101 other members of the Christian community (men, women, children, the elderly), gave their lives as martyrs during the terrible persecutions that occurred in Korea in the years 1839, 1846, and 1866.
- <u>Thu 21 Sept</u>: Feast Day for **St Matthew**, apostle and evangelist. Matthew was a tax collector, born at Capernaum, called by Jesus for whom he left everything and turned to a new life. His Gospel was written in Hebrew. Tradition suggests that he preached in the East.
- <u>Sat 23 Sept</u>: Memorial for **St Pius of Pietrelcina (Padre Pio), priest**. Francesco was born to peasant farmers in the Italian village of Pietrelcina on 25 May, 1887. Devout, even as a child, entered Capuchins 1902, ordained priest 1910. On Sept 20 1918, while kneeling in front of the crucifix he received the physical marks of the crucifixion. Blood from the stigmata was said to have the perfume of flowers. Renowned as a confessor. Died 23 Sept, 1968. His funeral was attended by 100,000 people.
