Notes from the Liturgy Committee

The Liturgy Committee is currently preparing for the Christmas Season and beginning to look forward to Lent and Easter.

The Saturday morning Mass will no longer be offered after the 30th December. The sacrament of Reconciliation Rite 1 (the 'Private Rite') which has been available at 9.30am on Saturdays will be transferred to **5.00pm on Saturday evenings**, beginning 6th January.

There are two times each year when Rite 2 of the Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated in the parish: once during Advent, and once during Lent. This is the Communal form of the sacrament where we pray and support one another in seeking absolution.

The committee is considering some ways that we as a parish can celebrate our patron, St Francis de Sales. His feast day is 24th January, a time when many are away on holiday. Perhaps at another time during the year? Any suggestions would be gratefully received and given due consideration.

RITE 2 RECONCILIATION FOR ADVENT. 7 PM HERE THIS SUNDAY, DECEMBER 10th

Mark's 'good news' begins with John the Baptist: 'a voice cries in the wilderness' ... 'prepare' ... 'make straight' ... 'repent'. People went to hear John not in the temple but in the desert, and what they heard challenged them to 'repent' and act justly. Only in this way could they recognise the one who was to come.

Feast Days in the Second Week of Advent

- Tue 12 Dec: Our Lady of Guadalupe. Our Lady appeared to the peasant farmer Juan Diego, leaving a miraculous image of herself on his cloak.
- Wed 13 Dec: St Lucy, virgin and martyr. Born in Syracuse, she lived her Christianity without concealment, and was martyred during the persecution of Diocletian.
- Thurs 14 Dec: St John of the Cross, priest and doctor of the Church. Born Spain 1542, became a Carmelite and ordained in 1567. St Teresa of Avila encouraged him to undertake a reform of his Order, but he was opposed and suffered many setbacks. His life of prayer bore fruit in writings that are classics of the mystical life. The Ascent of Mt Carmel, The Dark Night of the Soul, The Spiritual Canticle, The Living Flame of Love.

When we slow down to truly appreciate the Advent season, it can be transformative. It's not just a passive waiting; it's a distinct liturgical season marked by unique traditions, such as the Advent Wreath and Candles, which our Flower Group will gradually enhance over the next weeks. Catholics all over the world have participated in special activities and traditions outside of the liturgy to embrace this season of waiting. These may include attending Mass on a weekday, to experience things you may overlook in a busier Sunday Eucharist, or taking part in family activities such as those at the link below.
