# THIRD SUNDAY: GAUDETE SUNDAY: THE SHEPHERDS' CANDLE OF JOY.

"But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people..."

As we continue to approach Christmas Day our joy grows more and more. We are reminded of the joyful anticipation of the shepherds as they hurried towards Bethlehem to meet Jesus, the Lamb of God.

#### **OCTAVE BEFORE CHRISTMAS**

We have entered the Octave, or eight days, before Christmas, a period when our anticipation of the birth of the Emmanuel intensifies.

The **Gospel Acclamations** in this period welcome the approaching Messiah:

**Wisdom** of the Most High, ordering all things with strength and gentleness, come and teach us the way of truth.

**Ruler** of the House of Israel, who gave the law to Moses on Sinai, come and save us with outstretched arm.

**Root** of Jesse, set up as a sign to the peoples, come and save us, and delay no more.

**Key** of David, who open the gates of the eternal kingdom, come to liberate from prison the captive who lives in darkness.

**Morning Star**, radiance of eternal light, sun of justice, come and enlighten those who live in darkness and in the shadow of death.

**King** of the peoples and corner-stone of the Church, come and save mankind whom you made from the dust of the earth.

**Emmanuel**, our king and lawgiver, come and save us, Lord our God.

The entrance antiphon for the third Sunday of Advent remains true to tradition. It is from Paul's letter to the Philippians (4:4-5). It's first word is "Rejoice" or in Latin "Gaudete" — hence the common title for this day, "Gaudete Sunday". Today's readings (apart from the gospel) are filled with an infectious spirit of joy.

#### Feast Days in the Third Week of Advent

- Thurs 21 Dec: St Peter Canisius, priest and doctor of the Church. Born 1521, at Nijmegen in Holland. Entered Society of Jesus, ordained 1546 and went to Cologne where he founded a Jesuit house. A vigorous defender of Catholicism, he published a catechism which was influential in the Counter-Reformation. Died 1597.
- <u>Sat 23 Dec</u>: St John of Kanty, priest. Born in Kanty, Poland, in 1390. Was ordained and taught at the University of Cracow before becoming parish priest at Olkuscz. An outstanding teacher of the faith, his holiness and charity to all were noted. He died in 1473.
