Feast Days in the Third Week of Ordinary Time

- Mon 22 Jan: St Vincent, deacon and martyr. A deacon of the Church at Saragossa. He was put to death at Valencia in Spain, during the persecution of Diocletian, in about 304.
- <u>Wed 24 Jan</u>: Memorial for **St Francis de Sales, bishop and doctor of the Church**. Bishop of Geneva at the time of Calvin, he strove for the renewal of the faith. His "Introduction to the Devout Life" is a classic of spiritual direction, and is still read. He died on 28 Dec 1622, at the age of 55. Patron saint of journalists. Patron of our parish.
- <u>Thurs 25 Jan</u>: Feast for The Conversion of St Paul, Apostle. This day celebrates Paul's encounter with Jesus, in a blinding light, on the road to Damascus which so radically changed him. See Act 9:1-22 or Acts 22:3-16.
