

We are beginning a period of re-thinking the future of the Church in solidarity with the Synod of Rome, which begins its second session in October this Year. What does "synodality" mean for us and our Mission as the Church in Devonport?

We are proposing a series of conversations over four Sundays during Lent, to look more deeply into the meaning of "synodality" in our own context— listening to each other, talking together, praying and discerning..

The first of these will be on Sunday 18th February at 5.30 pm at the Church or the Hall, depending on numbers.

One of the key themes of the Synod is Participation. Please note the date and consider coming along. Your contribution is valued and important.

MEDITATION IN THE CHRISTIAN TRADITION

14th February is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. As part of this special time of the year the Takapuna parish is hosting an introductory course on Meditation in the Christian Tradition. Christian meditation is a simple way of being in God's presence through Jesus in the Holy Spirit. In stillness we enter into union with God. In silence we give our own spirit room to breathe and to be with a God who longs to be in union with us. It becomes the prayer of the heart and the practice of the presence of God. Some also report physical and mental benefits. The course starts on Tuesday 20th February from 7.30pm to 9-00-pm and will run for four weeks 20th & 27 February and 5th & **12th March.** It will be held in the St Joseph's parish Meeting Room, 10 Dominion St, Takapuna, (the old office) and led by members of the New Zealand Community for Christian Meditation. Feast Days in the Fourth Week of Ordinary Time

- Wed 31 Jan: St John Bosco, priest. Born in Turin in 1815 and brought up in poverty. Devoted his life to the education of working youth. Founded religious congregations – the Salesian Order (inspired by the life and work of Francis de Sales), and the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians – to carry on his ideals.
- <u>Thu 1 Feb</u>: St Brigid, religious. Born in the mid-400's, near Dundalk in Ireland. Her parents were baptized by St Patrick. Called to a religious life from a young age. In about 470 she founded a monastery at Cill-Dara (Kildare) and was Abbess of the convent, the first in Ireland, which developed into a center of learning and spirituality. Brigid was known for her spirituality, charity and compassion for those in distress. She is buried at Downpatrick, with St Columba, and St Patrick, with whom she is patron of Ireland.
- Fri 2 Feb: Feast of The Presentation of the Lord. Also known as "Candlemas Day" Candles are blessed and carried in procession to welcome Christ, the light to enlighten the Gentiles and the glory of his people. Also traditionally a Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life.
- <u>Sat 3 Feb</u>: St Blaise, bishop & martyr. Bishop of Sivas in Armenia in the fourth century. Patron saint of throat illnesses, and of wild animals.
- <u>Sat 3 Feb</u>: St Ansgar, bishop. Born in France 801, became a monk and in 826 set out to preach gospel in Denmark and then Sweden. Made bishop of Hamburg & papal legate to Denmark & Sweden by Gregory IV.
