Feast Days in the Second Week of Lent

• <u>Tue 27 Feb</u>: Saint Gregory of Narek, Abbot and Doctor of the Church. Widely venerated in the Armenian Church. Declared a Doctor of the Church in 2015 and inscribed on the Church Calendar as an Optional Memorial by Pope Francis in 2021. Born in 951, near Lake Van in modern-day Turkey. He became an abbot, priest and teacher of theology. Most famous for his work, "The Book of Lamentations," more commonly known as "The Book of Narek", a collection of ninety-five prayers which remains relevant and in use to this day.
