From the Parish Council:

As we head into 2024, we take note of a number of threads, emerging and continuing. We are beginning a period of re-thinking the future of the Church in solidarity with the Synod of Rome, which begins its second session in October this Year. What does "synodality" mean for us and our Mission as the Church in Devonport?

We are proposing a series of conversations over four Sundays during Lent, to look more deeply into the meaning of "synodality" in our own context— listening to each other, talking together, praying and discerning..

The first of these will be on Sunday 18th February at 4.30 pm at the Church or the Hall, depending on numbers.

One of the key themes of the Synod is Participation. Please note the date and consider coming along. Your contribution is valued and important. The healing of Simon's mother-in-law is a sign of the kingdom of life that Jesus had come to inaugurate. He heals the woman on the Sabbath when such actions were forbidden. For Jesus, giving life to someone was more important than formal religious restrictions.

MEDITATION IN THE CHRISTIAN TRADITION

Christian meditation is a simple way of being in God's presence through Jesus in the Holy Spirit. In stillness we enter into union with God. In silence we give our own spirit room to breathe and to be with a God who longs to be in union with us. It becomes the prayer of the heart and the practice of the presence of God. Some also report physical and mental benefits. **The course starts on Tuesday 20th February from 7.30pm to 9-00-pm and will run for four weeks 20th & 27 February and 5th & 12th March.** It will be held in the St Joseph's parish Meeting Room, 10 Dominion St, Takapuna, (the old office) and led by members of the New Zealand Community for Christian Meditation. Feast Days in the Fifth Week of Ordinary Time

- <u>Mon 5 Feb</u>: for St Agatha, virgin and martyr. Martyred at Catania, in Sicily, probably during the persecution of Decius. She is among the saints commemorated in the Roman Canon.
- <u>Tue 6 Feb</u>: Waitangi Day.
- Wed 7 Feb: Feast of The Presentation of the Lord. Also known as "Candlemas Day" St Paul Miki and companions, martyrs. Paul was the son of a Japanese military leader. Educated by the Jesuits and himself joined the Order in 1580, becoming known for his eloquent preaching. He was crucified, along with 25 other Catholics, at Nagasaki on 5 Feb. 1597 during the persecution of Christians under the Taiko, Toyotoni Hideyoshi, in the name of the Emperor. They were canonized in 1862 as the Martyrs of Japan.
- Thurs 8: St Josephine Bakhita. Born in the Sudan in 1869; kidnapped into slavery at an early age; taken to Italy by a good family where, in response to God's grace, entered the Daughters of Charity, where everyone still calls her "Mother Moretta" (our Black Mother). She died 8 Feb 1947 at the Canossian convent in Schio. Canonized in 2000.
- <u>Thurs 8 Feb</u>: St Scholastica, virgin. Born at Norcia in Umbria in the late 5th Century, the sister of St Benedict. She consecrated herself to God in early childhood, and lived near her brother's monastery at Monte Cassino.
