This week I took the lovely Year 5 and 6 tamariki to the New Zealand Maritime Museum as part of STEM. The New Zealand Maritime Museum organised Kōrinorino activities, and a pop-up container village with citizen science activities demonstrating the NZL Blue Belt ocean health monitoring tools. These activities included Marine Metre Squared, Photogrammetry, Plankton, Temperature and Baited Video Monitoring and Blake NZ VR Goggles (the children loved



this). The children then looked at the history of sailing in New Zealand and took part in a

challenge to identify devices and events linked to sailing. The tamariki had an amazing time learning about our environment and how to be the kaitiakitanga of our moana.
