
inspirational videos and had the opportunity to meet and share ideas with students from a wide range of other schools. A number of them took the stage during the less formal breakout

#### Feast Days in the Fifth Week of Lent

- Mon 18 Mar: St Cyril of Jerusalem, bishop & doctor of the Church. Cyril was born in 315, made bishop of Jerusalem in 348 when the Arian controversy was raging, he was exiled several times. In his Catecheses he set out the true teaching of Christianity and scripture and the tradition of the Church. Died in 386.
- <u>Tues 19 Mar</u>: St Joseph, Husband of Mary. A simple village carpenter, Joseph, the husband of Mary
  and guardian of the child Jesus, has become the guardian and patron of Christ's universal Church.
- <u>Sat 23 Mar</u>: for St Turibius de Mongrovejo, bishop. Born in Spain 1538, his ministry was exercised in Sth America, as Bishop of Lima, Peru, from 1581. The oppression of the native population by the European community, and the decadence of the clergy, led him to set about reforming the Church and caring for the oppressed with zeal. He died in 1606, while on one of his journeys through the diocese.
