John 15: 5

What we feed ourselves with will shape who we become.

This was the title of an article in the Wellington Catholic newspaper WelCom In August last year, written by Archbishop Paul Martin sm. He mentioned that when he celebrated Confirmation in many parishes, as Bishop Steven Lowe will be doing in our parish in June, he and parishioners are reminded of the gifts of the Holy Spirit we received in our own Confirmation. "They are not just passive elements of our spiritual life, they need to be used so as to develop in us and be fruitful".



Feast Days in the Fifth Week of Easter

- Mon 29 Apr: Feast of St Peter Chanel, priest and martyr. Born in France in 1803, he did pastoral work there for a few years after ordination, then entered the Marist Society and was sent to Oceania. There was resistance to missionaries at the time, though he did receive a few converts into the faith before being clubbed to death on the island of Futuna in 1841. Patron saint of Oceania.
- <u>Tue 30 Apr</u>: St Pius V, pope. Born near Allesandria, Italy, 1504. Entered Dominican Order, made Pope in 1566. He put into practice the reforming decrees of the Council of Trent which ended 1563: in his name the Catechism, Breviary and Missal were promulgated. He encouraged the praying of the Rosary. He died 1572.
- Wed 1 May: for St Joseph the Worker. The commemoration of St Joseph the Worker on this day was established by Pius XII in 1955. St Joseph is the patron of all working people.
- Thurs 2 May: St Athanasius, bishop and doctor of the Church. Born Alexandria 295. Attended Council of Nicea in 325 called to rebut heresy of Arius, which denied the divinity of Christ. Became bishop of Alexandria in 328 and was tireless in combating the heresy. Exiled five times for his persistence. He wrote brilliantly, both in defense of doctrine, and on spiritual matters.
- Fri 3 May: Feast of Ss Philip and James, Apostles. Philip, born at Bethsaida, was a disciple of John the Baptist, who followed the call of Christ. James, the son of Alphaeus (not James the brother of John). The Lord appeared to him after the resurrection; he is the writer of one of the Epistles. He belonged to the Church at Jerusalem, and was martyred there in 62AD.
