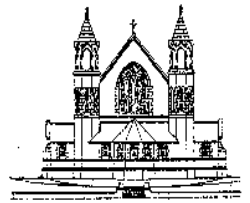

Notes from the Liturgy Committee

Feast Days in the Tenth Week of Ordinary Time

- **Tues 11 June: St Barnabas, apostle.** Born in Cyprus. One of the first converts in Jerusalem, soon after Pentecost. Barnabas went with St Paul on his first missionary journey, and took part in the Council of Jerusalem. Then he returned to Cyprus to preach the gospel, and died there.
- **Thurs 13 June: St Anthony of Padua, priest and doctor of the Church.** Born Lisbon, Portugal, 1195. Entered the Canons Regular of St Augustine, but after ordination, joined the Friars Minor. Exceptional talent as a preacher, and was sent throughout Italy and France to preach against the Catharist heresy. He was the first theologian of the Franciscan Order. He died in 1231.



A Vatican review has cleared Cardinal John Dew of an abuse accusation. He is now free to resume public Church activities. After reviewing the complaint dated back to the 1970s, the Vatican decided no further Church inquiry was required. The Vatican's finding is similar to that of the New Zealand Police, which concluded earlier this year that Cardinal John Dew had no case to answer. The Catholic Metropolitan Archbishop, Paul Martin, confirmed the Vatican finding.
